Grand Canyon National Park, a World Heritage Site, covers more than 1,900 square miles, and the gorge from which it takes its name was six million years in the making. At least a mile deep, up to 18 miles wide, and 277 miles long, it was carved out by the Colorado River. Theodore Roosevelt said of the Grand Canyon, “It is beyond comparison—beyond description,” and urged every American to see it.
